April Talk Wednesday 10th 2.15pm at the Hi-Tide Monthly Talk by Doug Jones: Ireland and the Troubles 1969 - 2007



What became known as 'The Troubles' raged for more than 30 years. It was a period of viciousness and brutality that affected Northern Ireland mainly but also the Republic of Ireland, mainland Britain and other countries too.

Doug will briefly trace the root causes of the conflict, remind us of the most tragic acts of violence, the legal punishments imposed on the perpetrators and the constant attempts to find a resolution, Finally, he will describe the so-called Peace Process that led to the Good Friday Agreement and its implementation.


